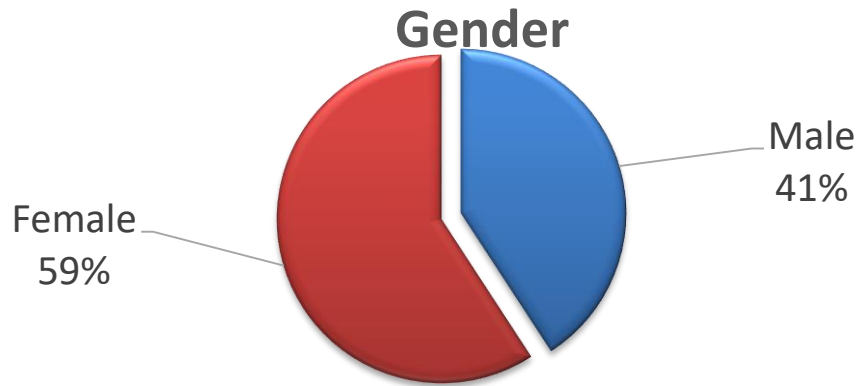


Navajo Nation Human Rights Commission 2017 Fiscal Year – Third Quarter Data 49 Active Cases

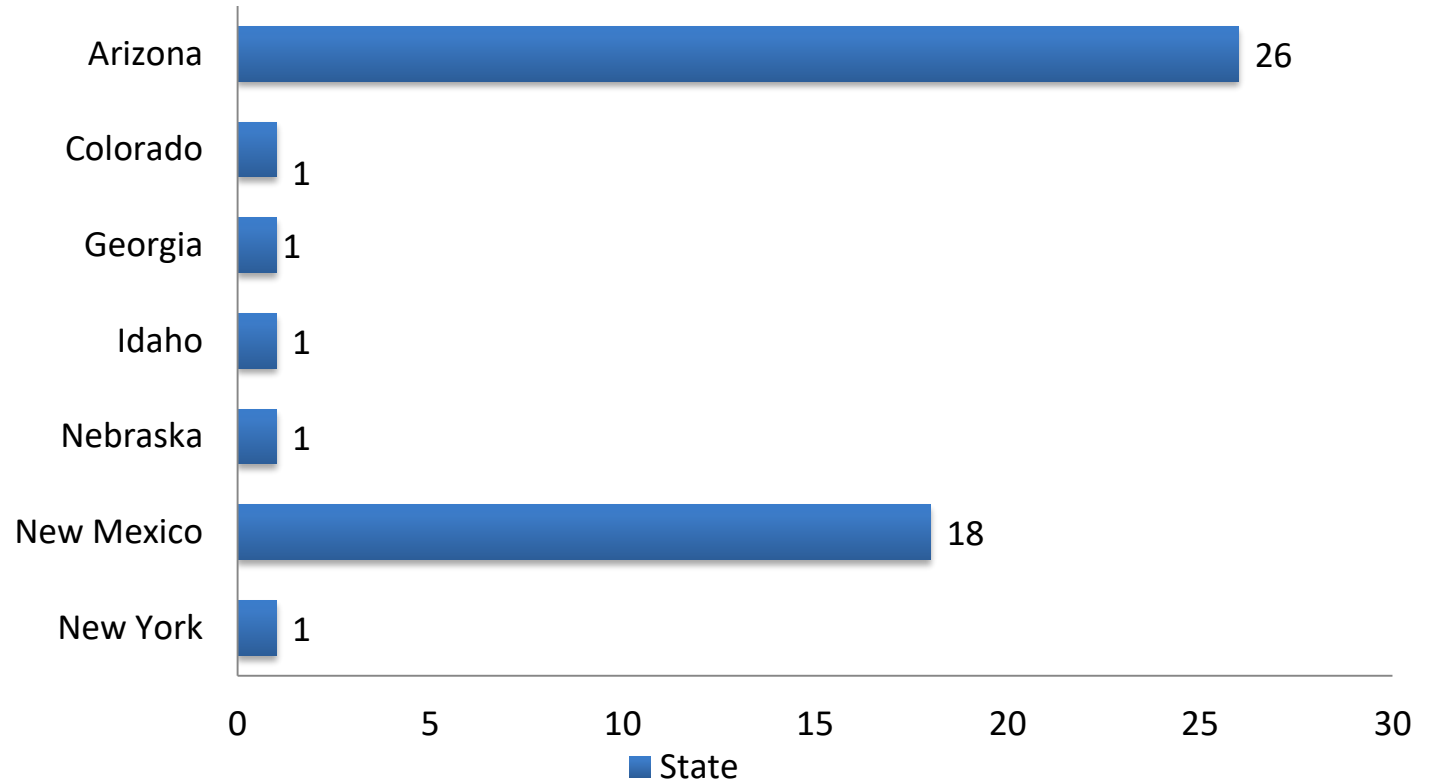

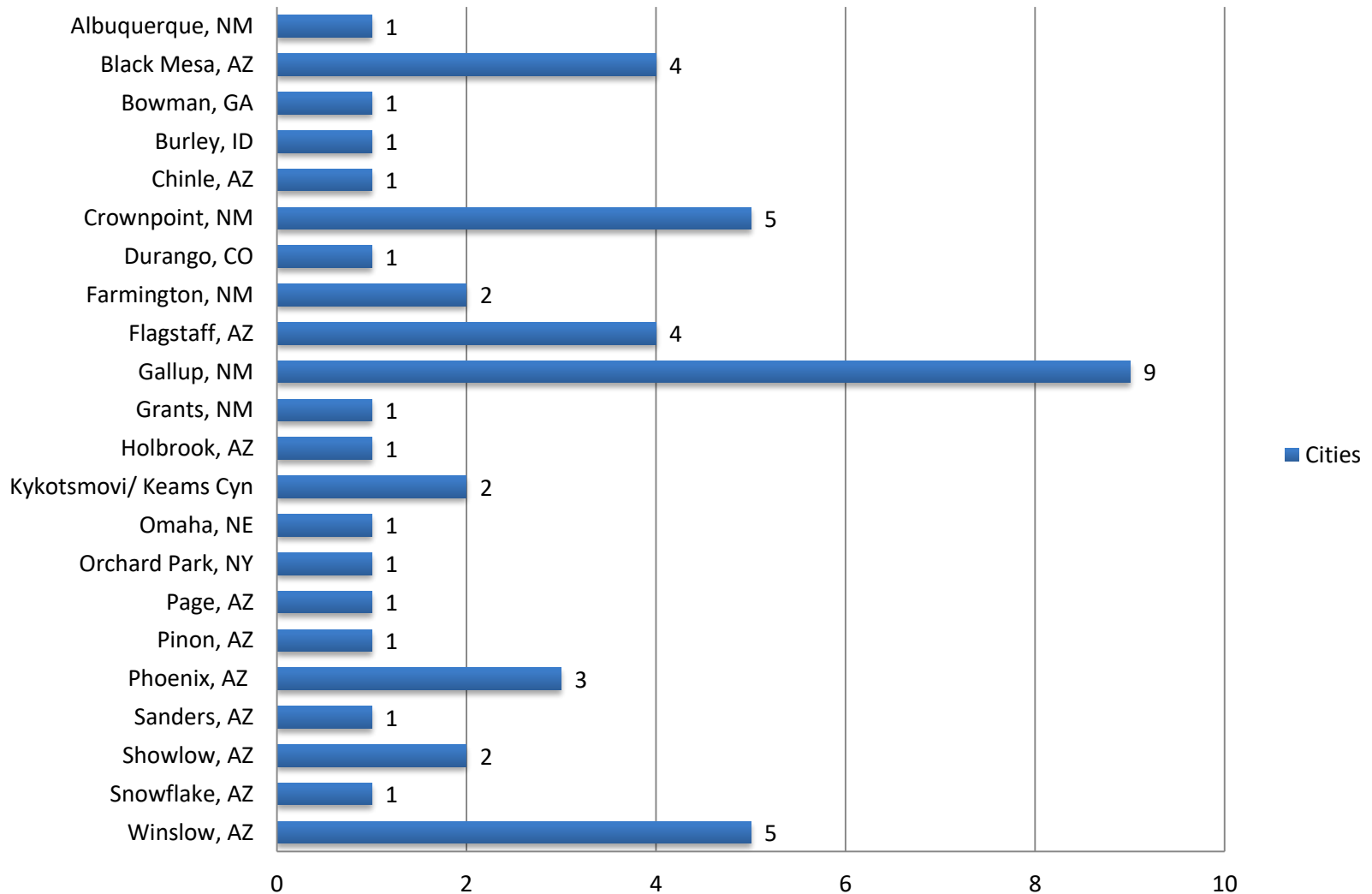
The chart shows that the beginning of April 2017 through the end of June 2017, the Office of the Navajo Nation Human Rights (“Office”) had 49 cases listed as “active” in which written complaints were either being investigated and/or monitored. Of the 49 (100%) cases, 29 (59%) of the cases were brought forth by Navajo women compared to 20 (41%) Navajo men.

Complaint Originated By State



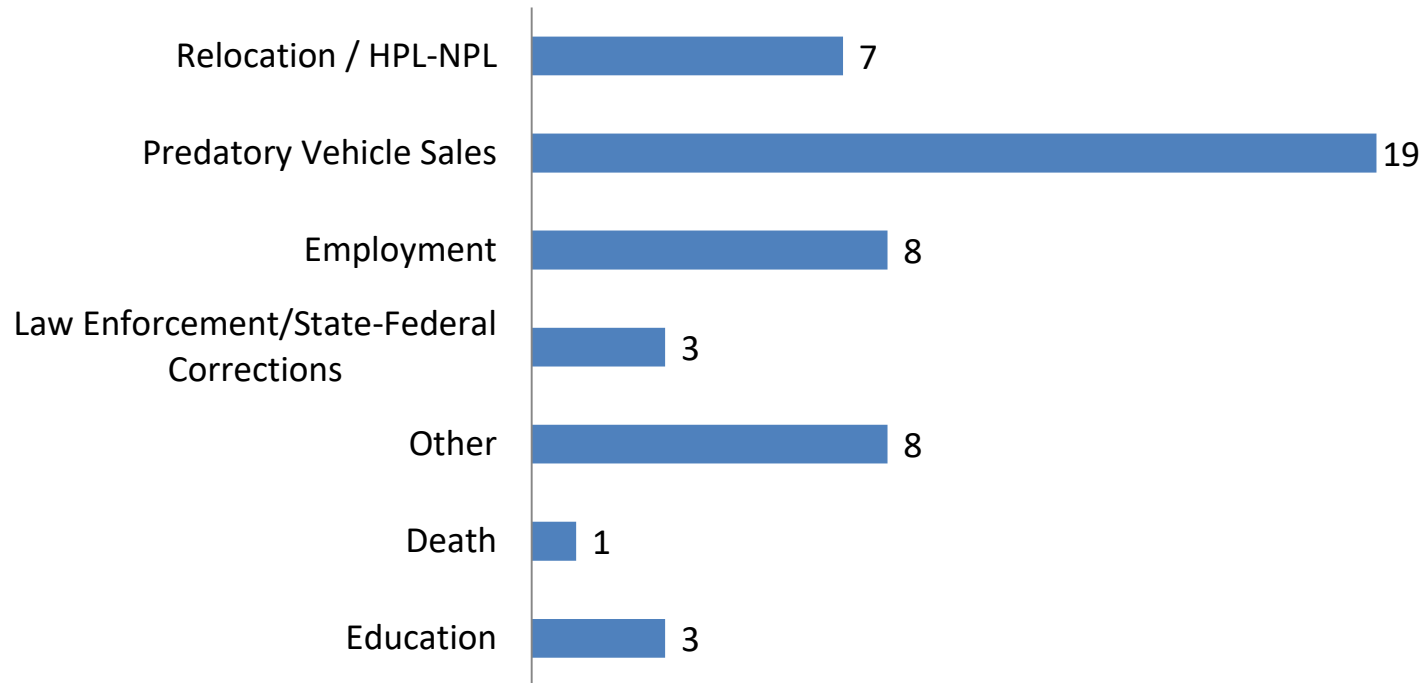
The graph shows the state as to where each case came from. For example, of the 49 active cases, 26 cases originated in the State of Arizona; 18 active cases came from New Mexico; and 1 case each came from Colorado, Georgia, Idaho, Nebraska and New York respectively.

Complaint Origin by City



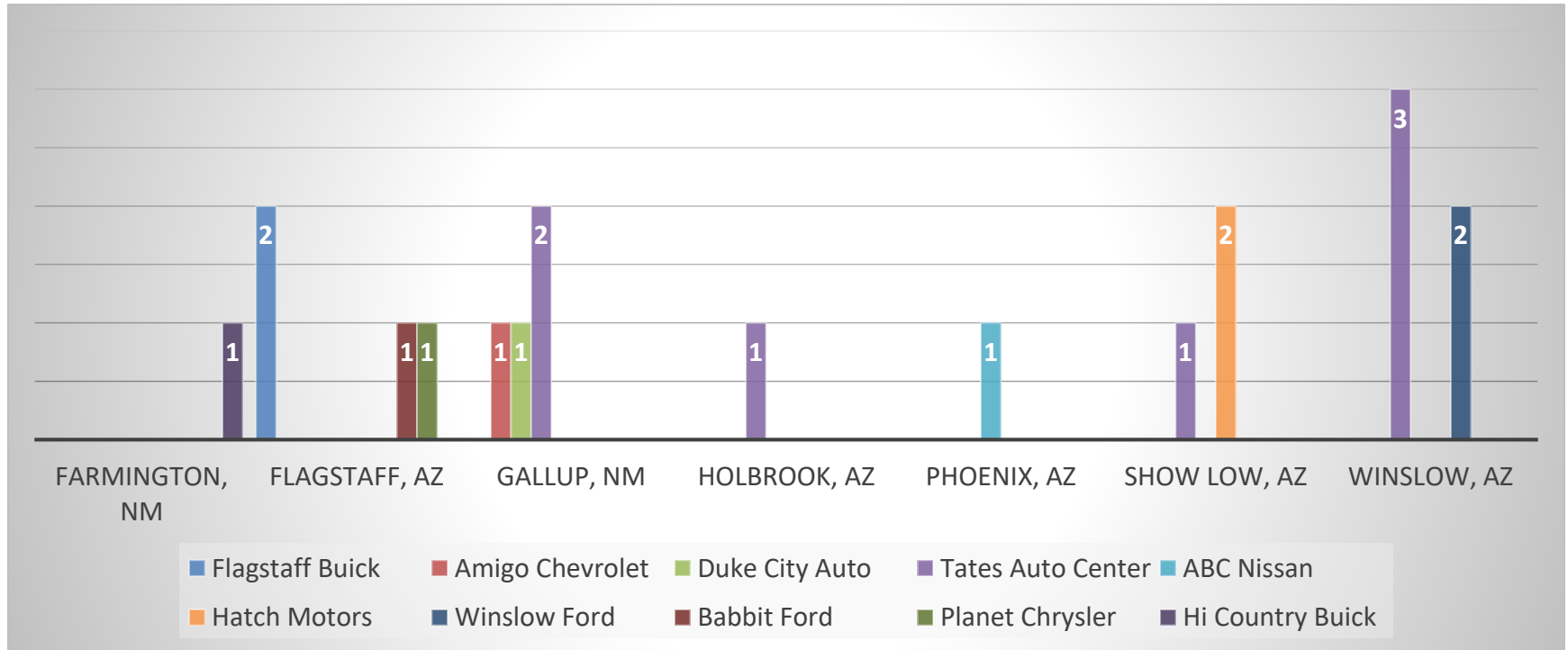
The graph shows the breakdown of complaints by city and state in which issues arise from. For example, one complaint apiece originated in Albuquerque, NM; Bowman, Georgia; Burley, Idaho; Chinle, AZ; Durango, Colorado; Grants, NM; Holbrook, AZ; Omaha, Nebraska; Orchard Park, New York; Page, AZ; Pinon, AZ; Sanders, AZ; and Snowflake, AZ. Two complaints were initiated in Farmington, NM; Kykotsmovi, AZ and Show Low, AZ respectively. Three complaints resulted from issues occurring in Phoenix, AZ. Four complaints each arise in Black Mesa, AZ and Flagstaff, AZ. Five complaints each stemmed from Crownpoint, NM and Winslow, AZ. Lastly, nine complaints were filed because of issues arising in Gallup, NM.

Complaint by Category



The table provides a general description of the discriminatory and/or human rights issues presented in each complaint filed. For example, there are seven complaints involving Hopi Partitioned Land – Relocation. Nineteen complaints are concerned with Predatory Vehicle Sales. The “Employment” & “Other” category each contain eight complaints. . The “Other” category includes various issues such as Bank-fraud, Property, Homeless beating, Wal-Mart Consumer mistreatment, Payday Loan & Social Security Benefits. Three complaints each list border town Law Enforcement/Department of Corrections and Education as a cause for concern. Finally, one complaint entails a death of a family member.

Predatory Auto Sale by Dealership & Location



The graph shows the name and location of the automobile dealers where predatory sales is a concern. For example, one complaint identifies High Country Buick in Farmington, New Mexico as a concern. In Flagstaff, Arizona, two complaints list Flagstaff Buick as an alarm. Also in Flagstaff, Arizona, one complaint each list Babbit Ford and Planet Chrysler as a concern. In Gallup, New Mexico, individual complaints were received regarding Amigo Chevrolet and Duke City Auto with two complaints filed concerning Bates Auto Center. In Holbrook, Arizona, one complaint was filed regarding Bates Auto Center. In Phoenix, Arizona, one complaint filed involved ABC Nissan. In Show Low, Arizona, Bates Auto Center had one complaint while Hatch Motors had two complaints filed regarding questionable sales. Lastly, in Winslow, Arizona, Bates Auto Center had three complaints filed while Winslow Ford had two complaints filed involving problematic sales.
