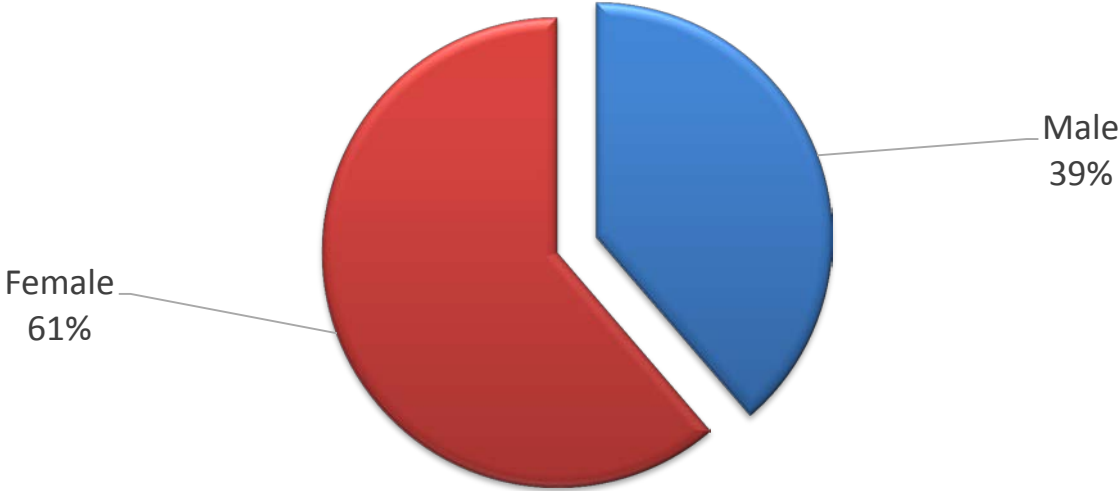

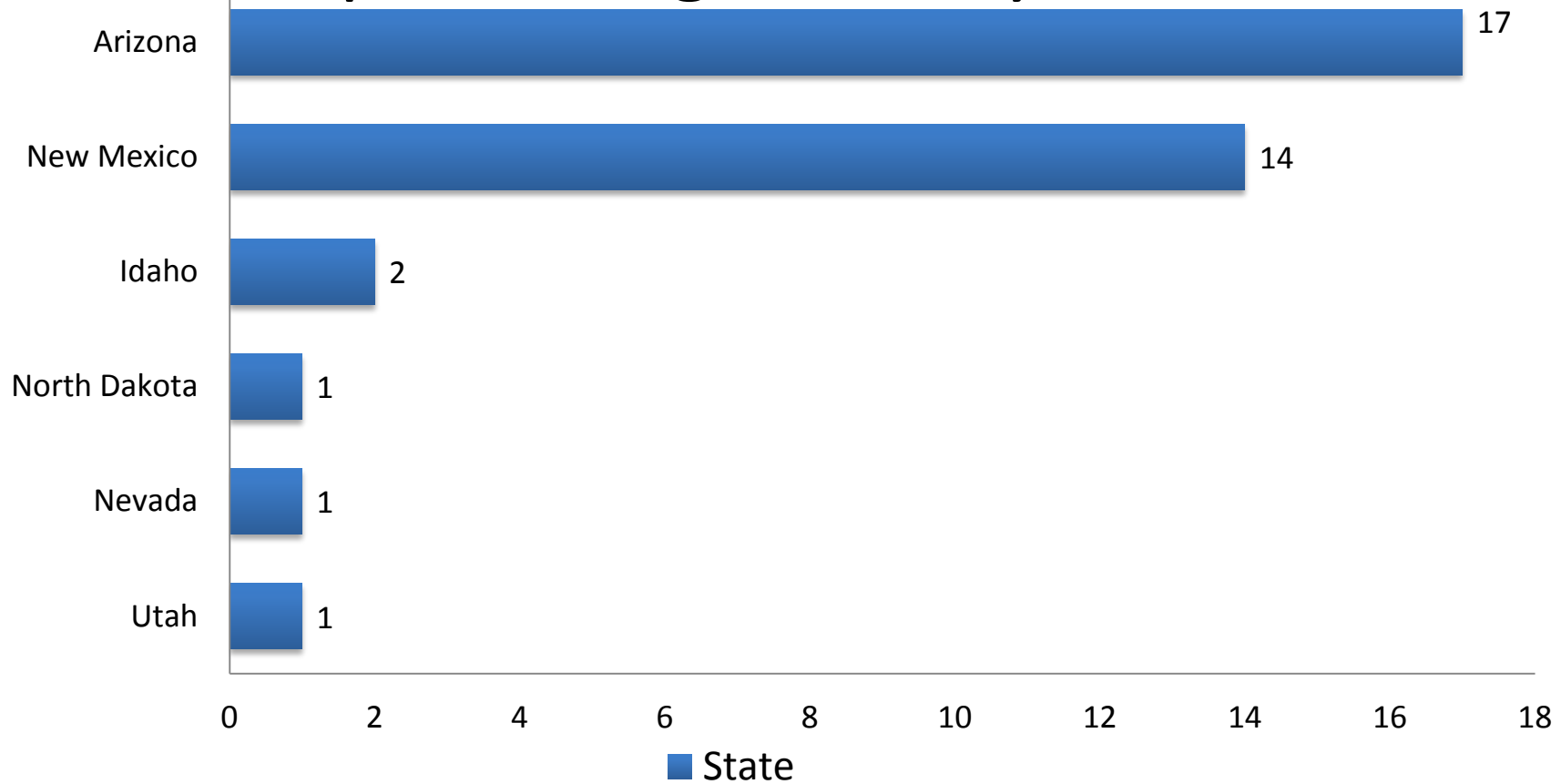

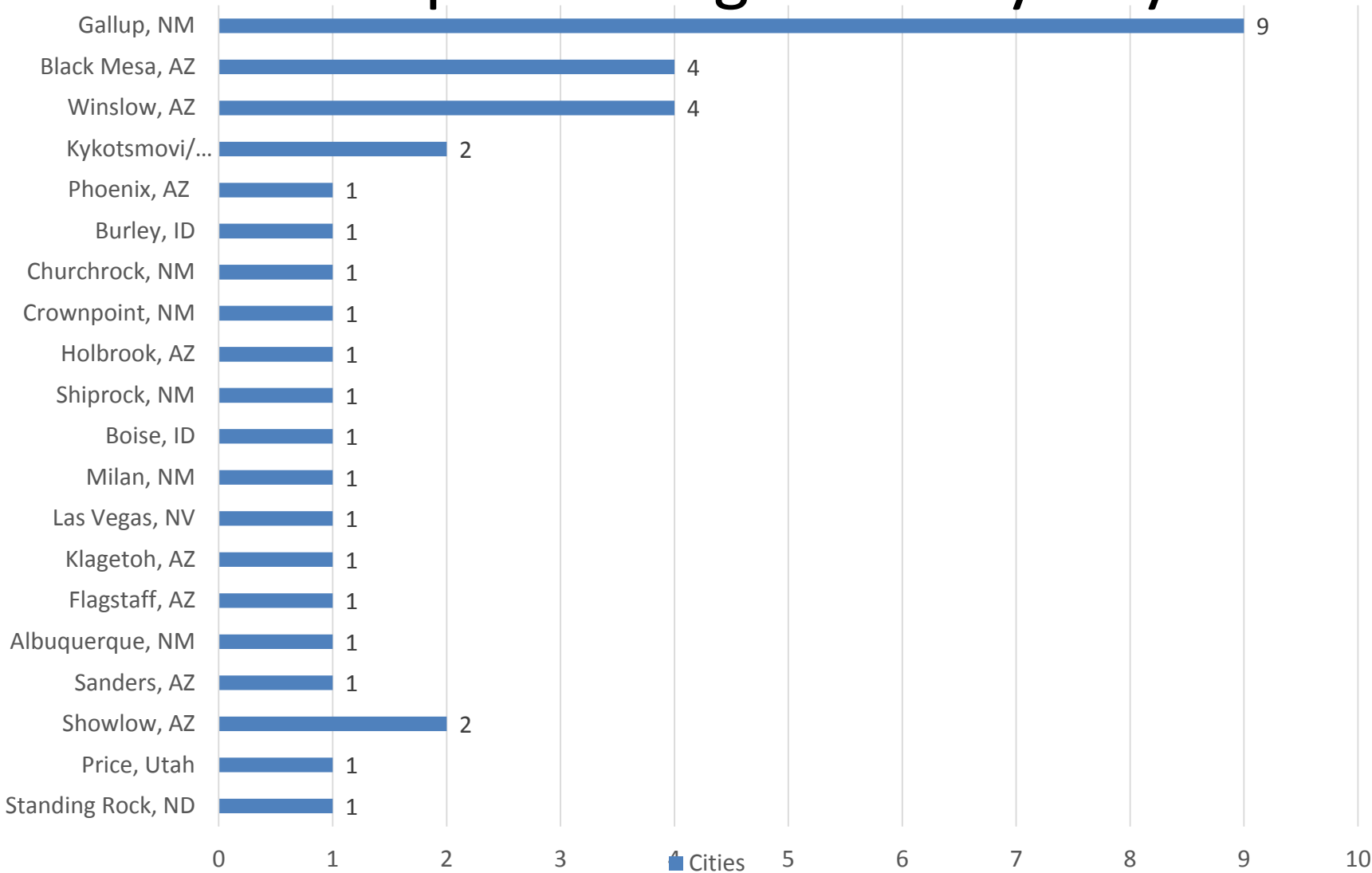
This chart and the following charts show the data obtained from the written complaints filed with the Office of the Navajo Nation Human Rights (“Office”) between April 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018. As indicated, the Office had 36 cases listed as “active” in which written complaints were either being investigated and/or monitored. Of the 36 (100%) cases, 19 (61%) of the cases were brought forth by Navajo women compared to 17 (39%) by Navajo men.

# Complaint Originated By State



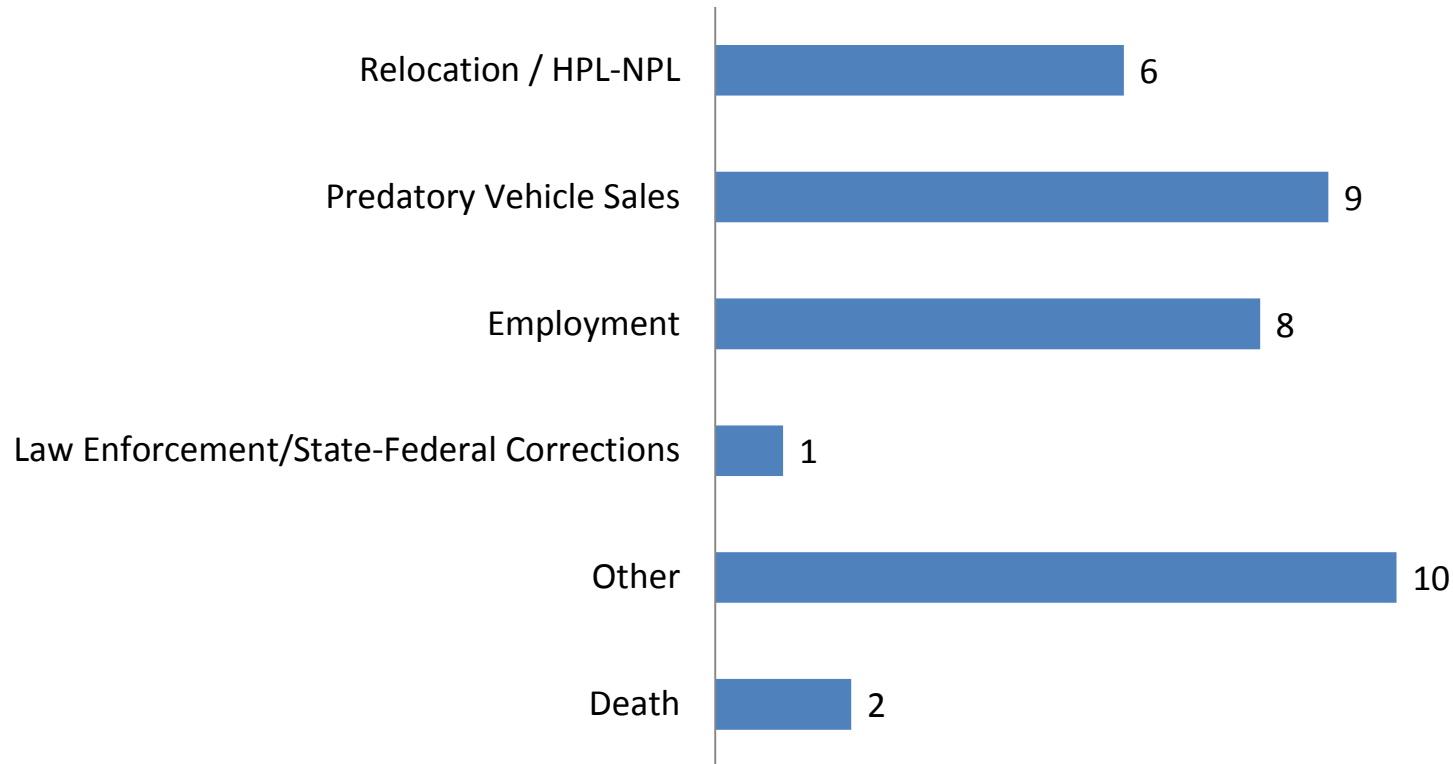
This chart shows the state from where each case came from. For example, of the 36 active cases, 17 cases originated in the State of Arizona; 14 active cases came from the State of New Mexico; 2 cases came from Idaho; and 1 case each was filed from North Dakota, Nevada and Utah.

# Complaint Originated by City



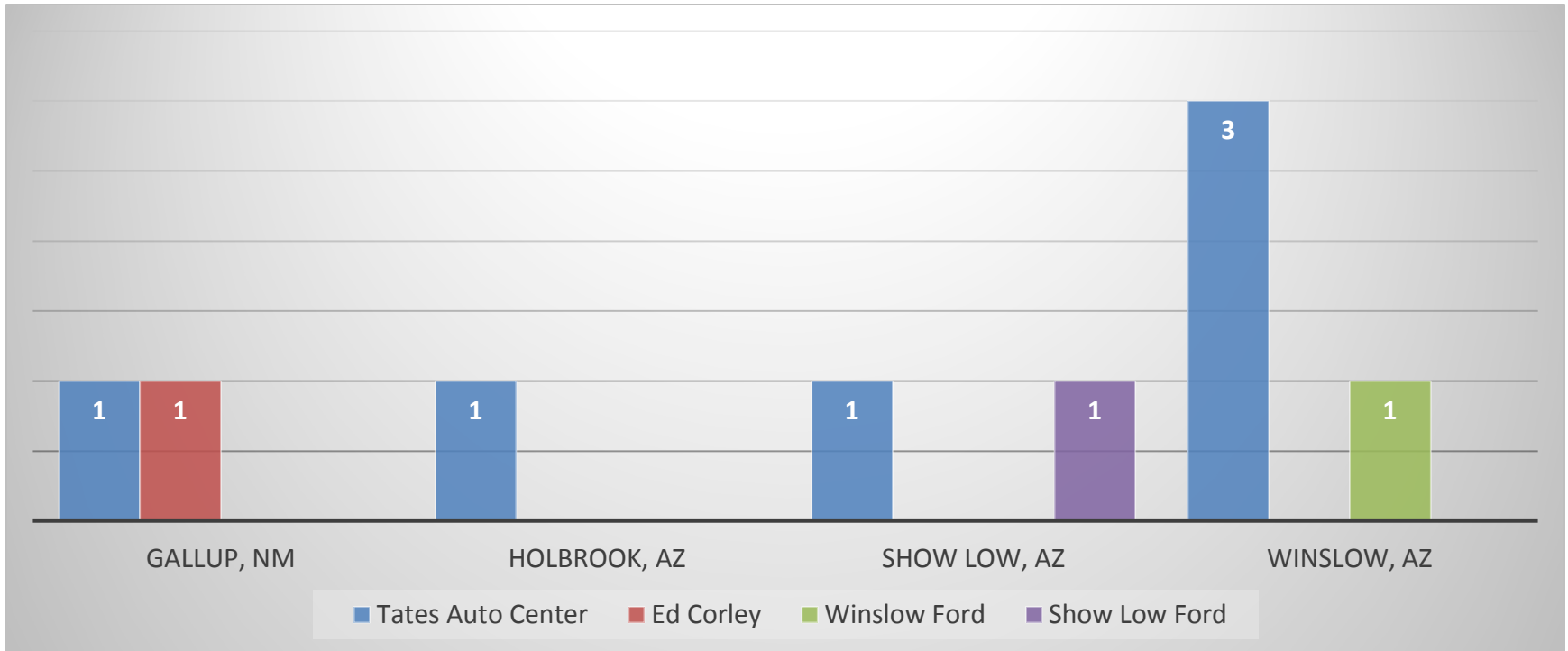
This next chart shows the breakdown of the complaints by city and state. For example, one complaint apiece originated in Phoenix, AZ; Burley, ID; Churchrock, NM; Crownpoint, NM; Holbrook, AZ; Shiprock, NM; Boise, ID; Milan, NM; Las Vegas, NV; Klagetoh, AZ; Flagstaff, AZ; Albuquerque, NM; Sanders, AZ; Price, Utah; and Standing Rock, ND. Two complaints were initiated in Kykotsmovi, AZ and Show Low, AZ. Four complaints each arised in Black Mesa, AZ and Winslow, AZ. Lastly, nine complaints originated in Gallup, NM.

# Complaint by Category



The following chart shows the issues identified in the written complaints which are categorized accordingly. For example, of the 36 complaints, 9 complaints are concerned with Predatory Vehicle Sales while 8 complaints cite issues with Employment. Six complaints involved Hopi Partitioned Land – Relocation. Ten complaints were categorized as “Other” which included various issues such as Property, Loan Company, Standing Rock Protest and an Estranged In-law Relationship with a Navajo Family. Two complaints were concerned with Death and one complaint identified Law Enforcement/State Corrections as problematic.

## Predatory Auto Sale by Dealership & Location



This last chart shows the name and location of the automobile dealers where predatory sales is a concern. For example, one complaint each identified Winslow Ford in Winslow, AZ; Show Low Ford in Show Low, AZ; and Tate's Auto Center in Gallup, NM, Holbrook, AZ, and Show Low, AZ as a concern. And, three complaints list Tate's Auto Center in Winslow, AZ as an alarm.
