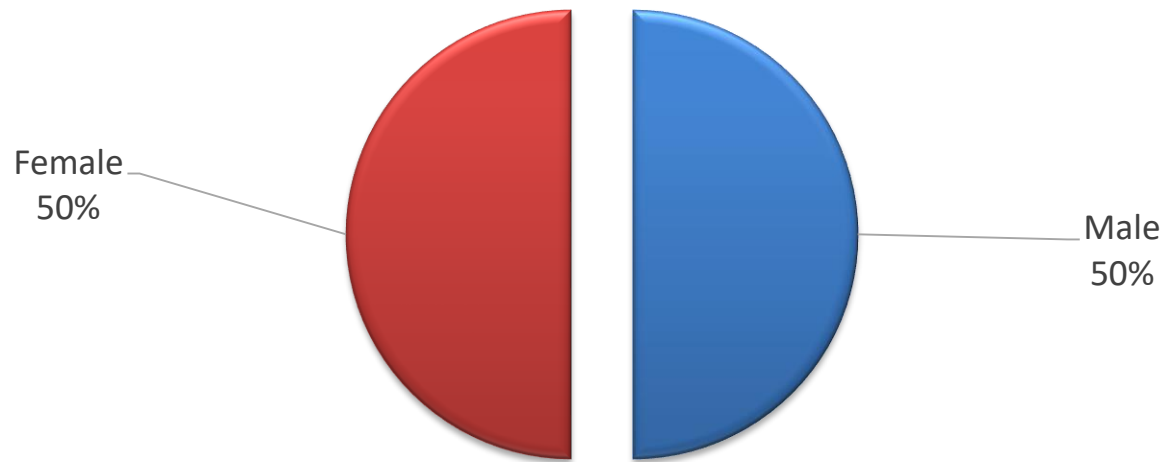


# Navajo Nation Human Rights Commission 2018 Fiscal Year – Fourth Quarter Data 34 Total Active Cases

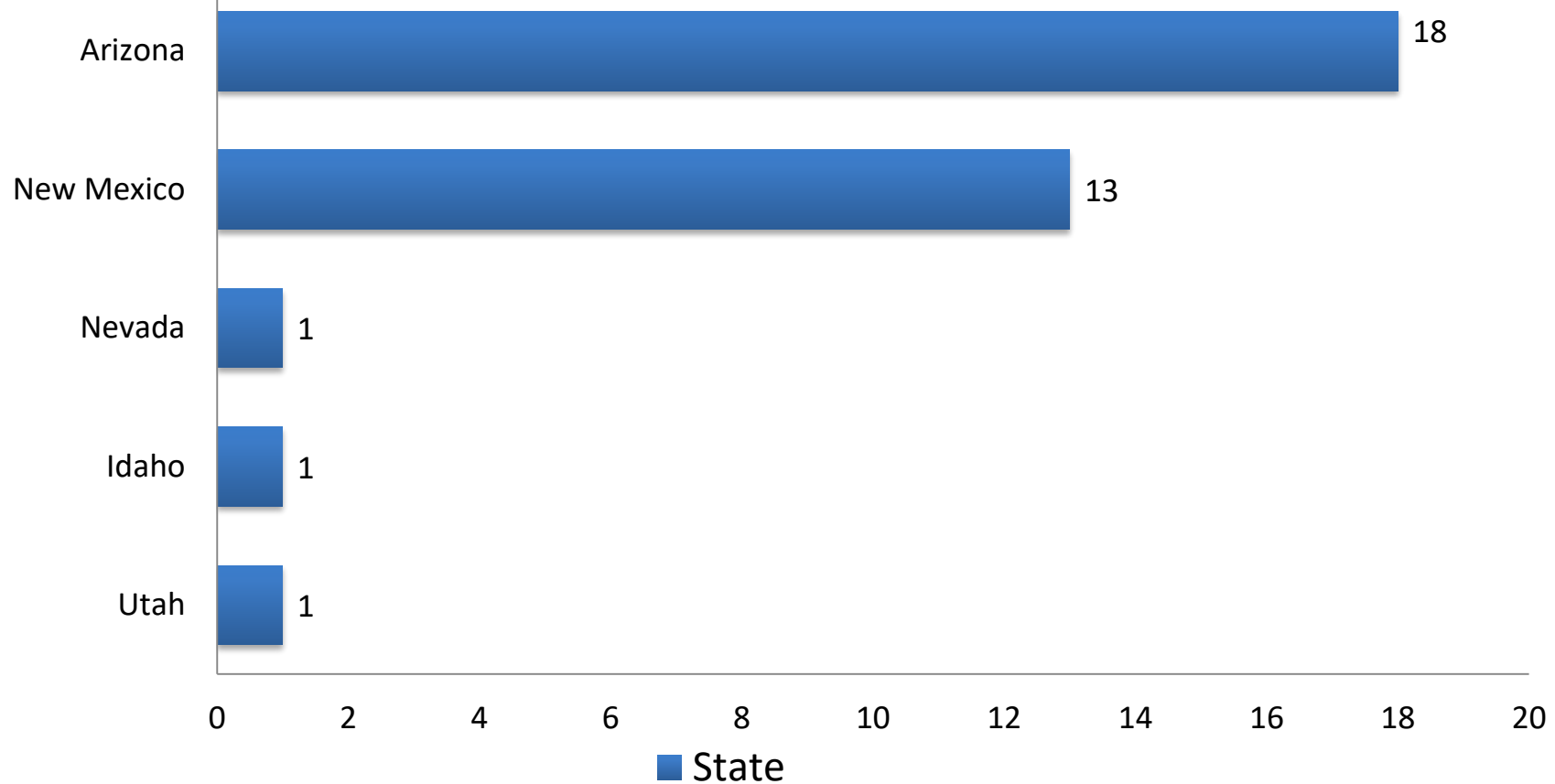
## Gender



Female – 17    Male – 17

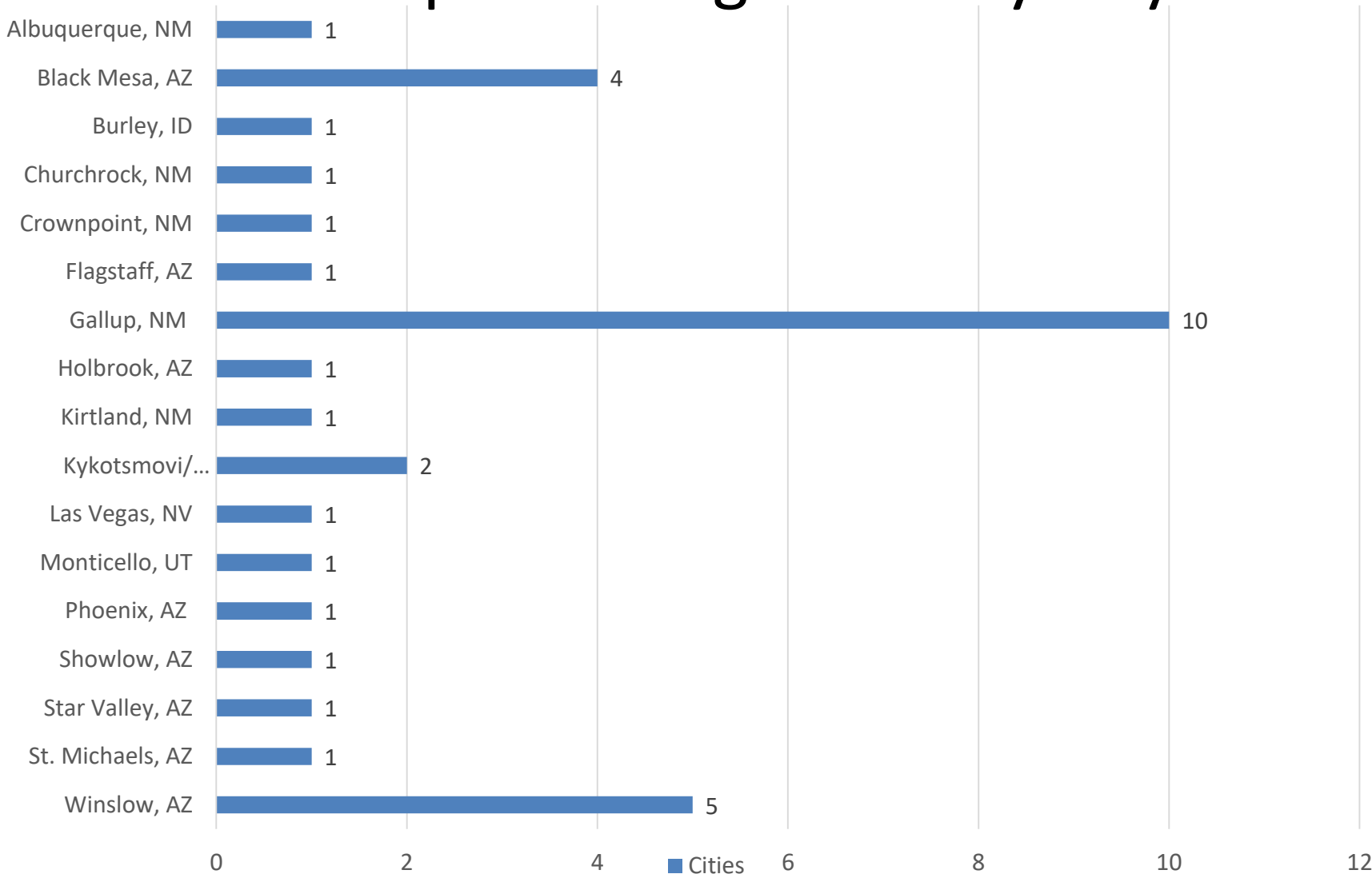
This chart and the following charts show the data obtained from the written complaints filed with the Office of the Navajo Nation Human Rights (“Office”) between July 1, 2018 through September 1, 2018. As indicated, the Office had 34 cases listed as “active” in which written complaints were either being investigated and/or monitored. Of the 34 (100%) cases, 17 (50%) of the cases were brought forth by Navajo women compared to 17 (50%) by Navajo men.

# Complaint Originated By State



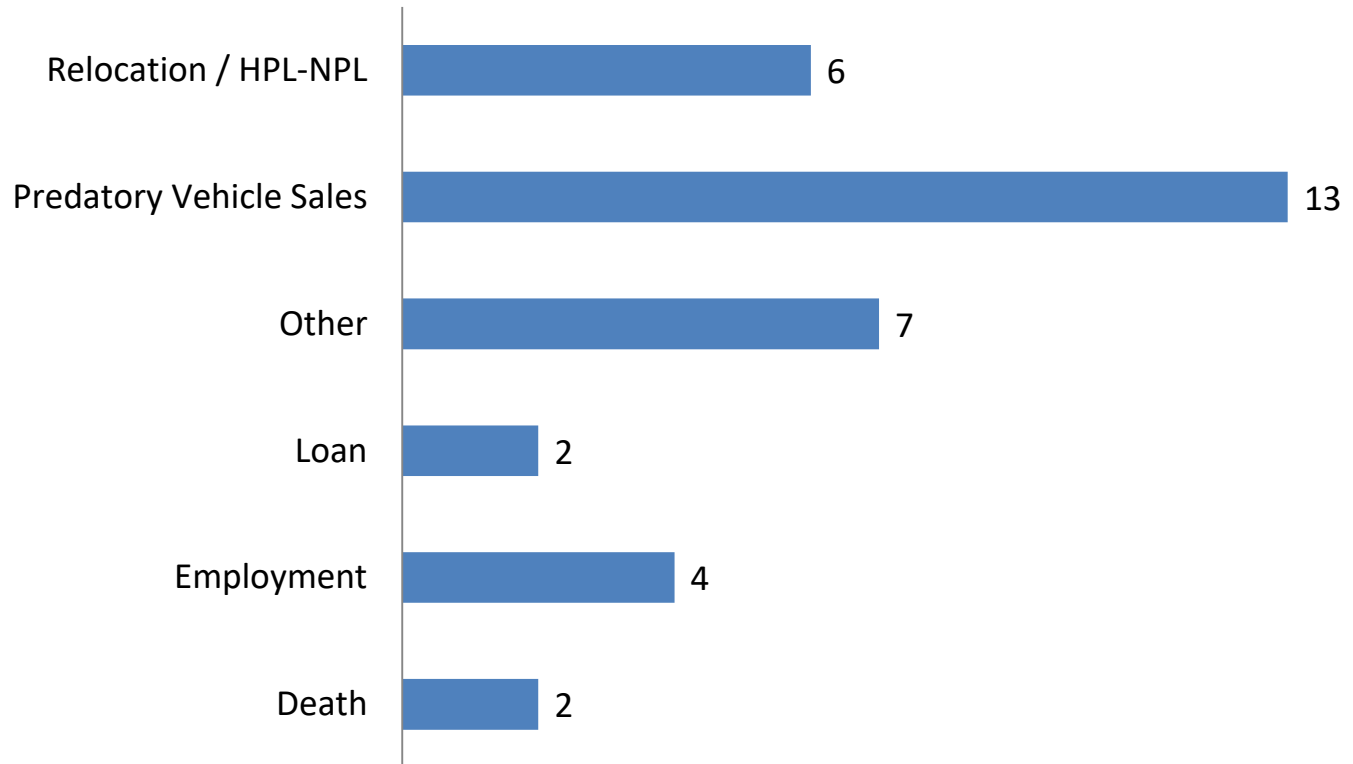
This chart shows the state from where each case came from. For example, of the 34 active cases, 18 cases originated in the State of Arizona; 13 active cases came from the State of New Mexico; and 1 case each was filed from Idaho, Nevada, and Utah.

# Complaint Originated by City



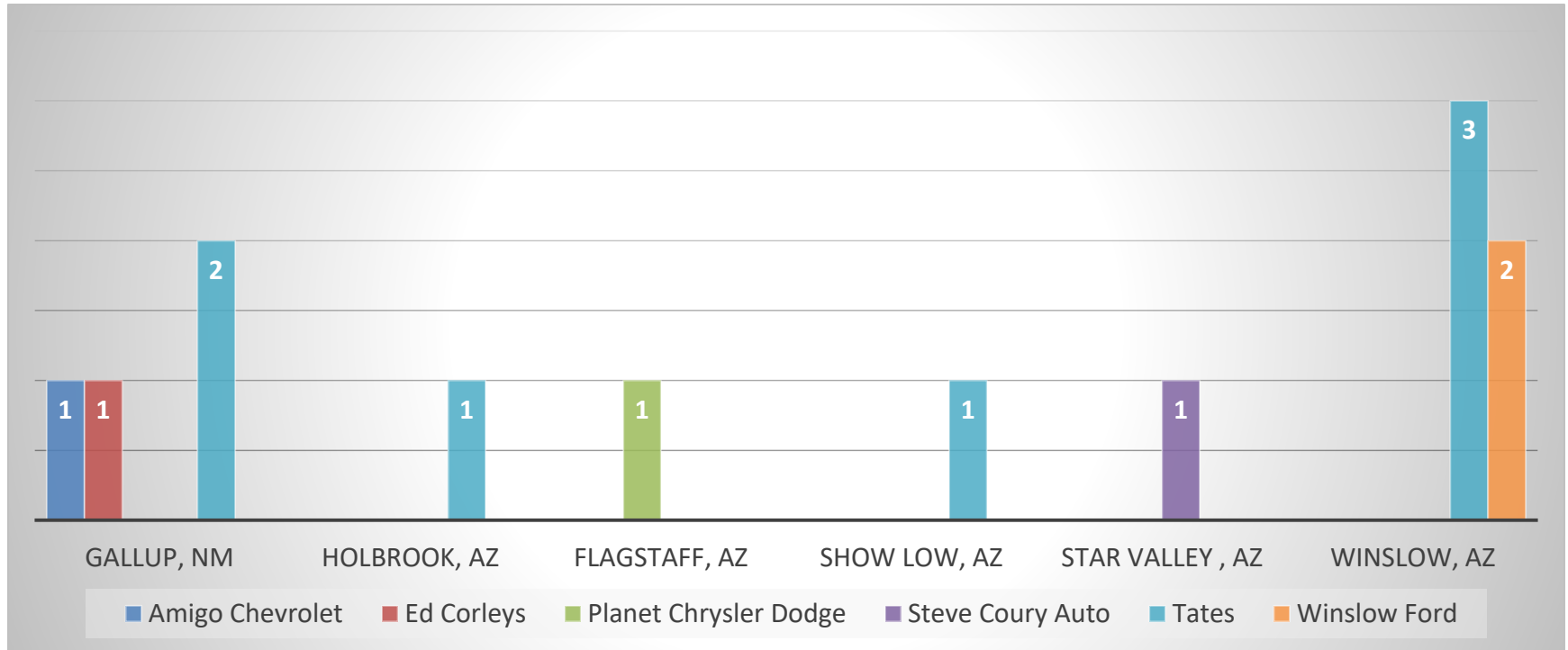
This next chart shows the breakdown of the complaints by city and state. For example, one complaint a piece originated in Albuquerque, NM, Burley, ID, Churchrock, NM, Crownpoint, NM, Flagstaff, AZ, Holbrook, AZ, Kirtland, NM, Las Vegas, NV, Monticello, UT, Phoenix, AZ, Showlow, AZ, Star Valley, AZ, and St. Michaels, AZ . Two complaints were initiated in Kykotsmovi, AZ. Four complaints each arise in Black Mesa, AZ. Five complaints derived from Winslow, AZ. Lastly, ten complaints originated in 3 Gallup, NM.

# Complaint by Category



The following chart shows the issues identified in the written complaints which are categorized accordingly. For example, of the 34 complaints, Six complaints involved Hopi Partitioned Land – Relocation. Thirteen complaints each concerned with Predatory Vehicle Sales. Seven complaints were categorized as “Other” which included various issues such as Law Enforcement Facility, Estranged In-law Relationship with a Navajo Family, Irrigation Services, Fraud, Harassment, Voting Rights, and Sexual Harassment. Two complaints pertained to Loan issues. Four complaints regarded to Employment. Finally, two complaint each identified Death as problematic. 4

## Predatory Auto Sale by Dealership & Location



This last chart shows the name and location of the automobile dealers where predatory sales is a concern. For example, one complaint each identified Amigo Chevrolet, in Gallup, NM; Ed Corleys in Gallup, NM; Tate's in Holbrook, AZ; Planet Chrysler Dodge in Flagstaff, AZ; Tate's in Showlow, AZ; & Steve Coury Auto in Star Valley, AZ as a concern. And, Two complaints each list Tate's Auto Center in Gallup, NM & Winslow Ford in Winslow, AZ as an alarm. Lastly, three complaints classified Tate's Auto Center in Winslow, AZ as problematic.
