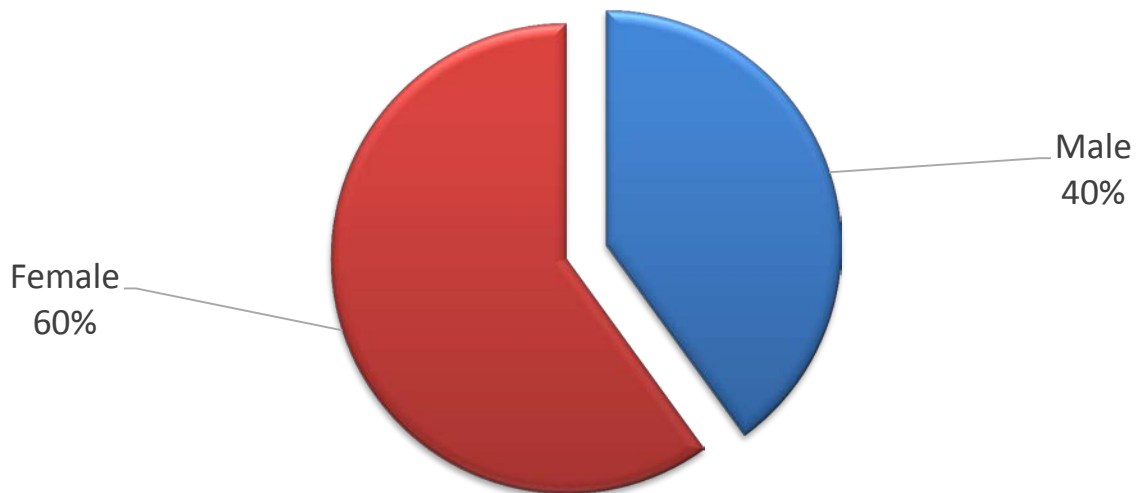


Navajo Nation Human Rights Commission 2017 Fiscal Year – Fourth Quarter Data 35 Total Active Cases

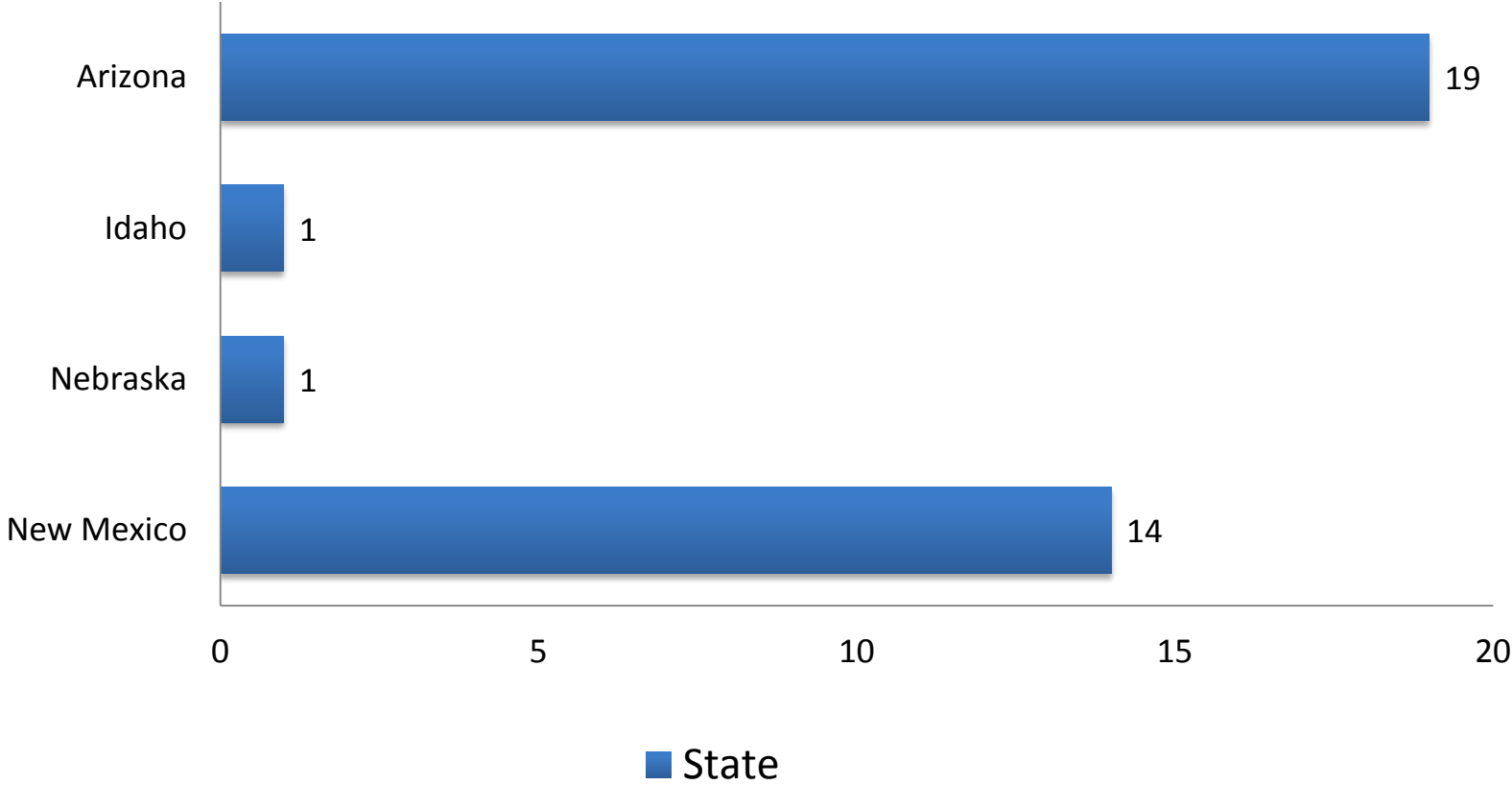
Gender



Female – 21 Male – 14

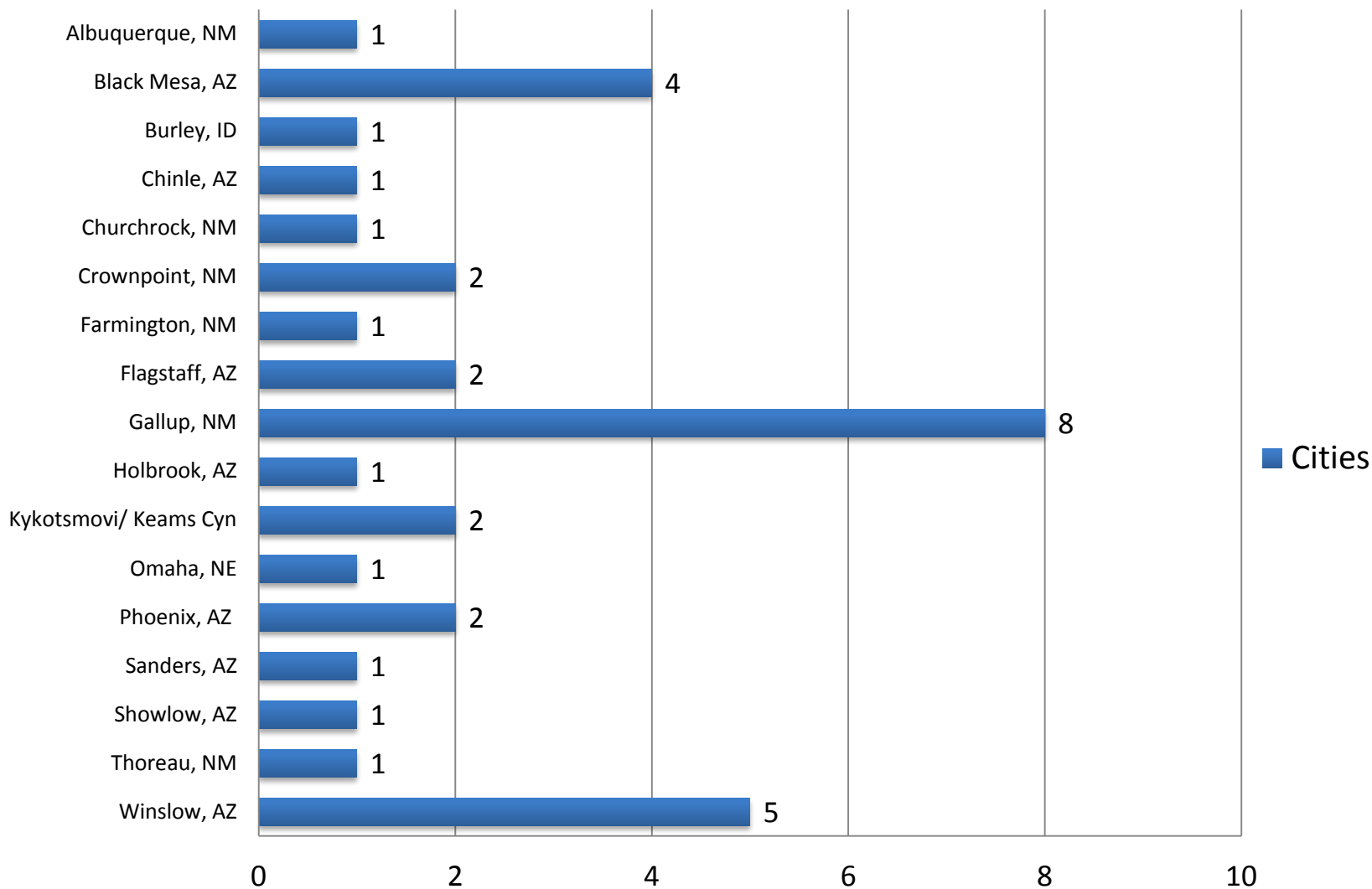
This chart and the following charts show the data obtained from the written complaints filed with the Office of the Navajo Nation Human Rights (“Office”) between July 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017. As indicated, the Office had 35 cases listed as “active” in which written complaints were either being investigated and/or monitored. Of the 35 (100%) cases, 21 (60%) of the cases were brought forth by Navajo women compared to 14 (40%) by Navajo men.

Complaint Originated By State



This chart shows the state from where each case came from. For example, of the 35 active cases, 19 cases originated in the State of Arizona; 14 active cases came from the State of New Mexico; and 1 case each came from Idaho and Nebraska respectively.

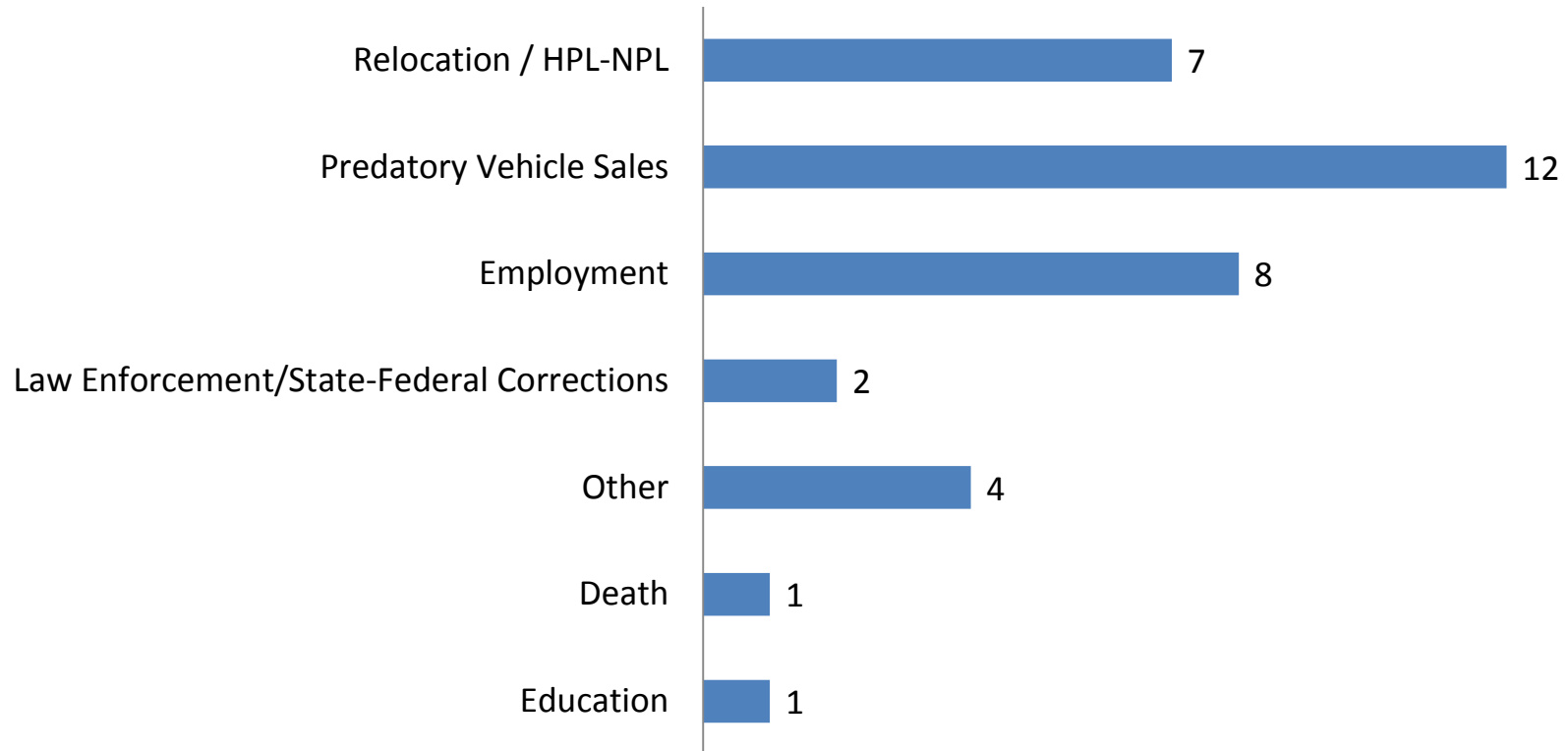
Complaint Originated by City



This next chart shows the breakdown of the complaints by city and state. For example, one complaint apiece originated in Albuquerque, NM; Burley, ID; Chinle, AZ; Churchrock, NM; Farmington, NM; Holbrook, AZ; Omaha, NE; Sanders, AZ; Showlow, AZ; and Thoreau, NM. Two complaints respectively were initiated in Crownpoint, NM; Flagstaff, AZ; Kykotsmovi, AZ; and Phoenix, AZ. Four complaints arise in Black Mesa, AZ. Five complaints stemmed from Winslow, AZ. Lastly, eight complaints originated in Gallup, NM.

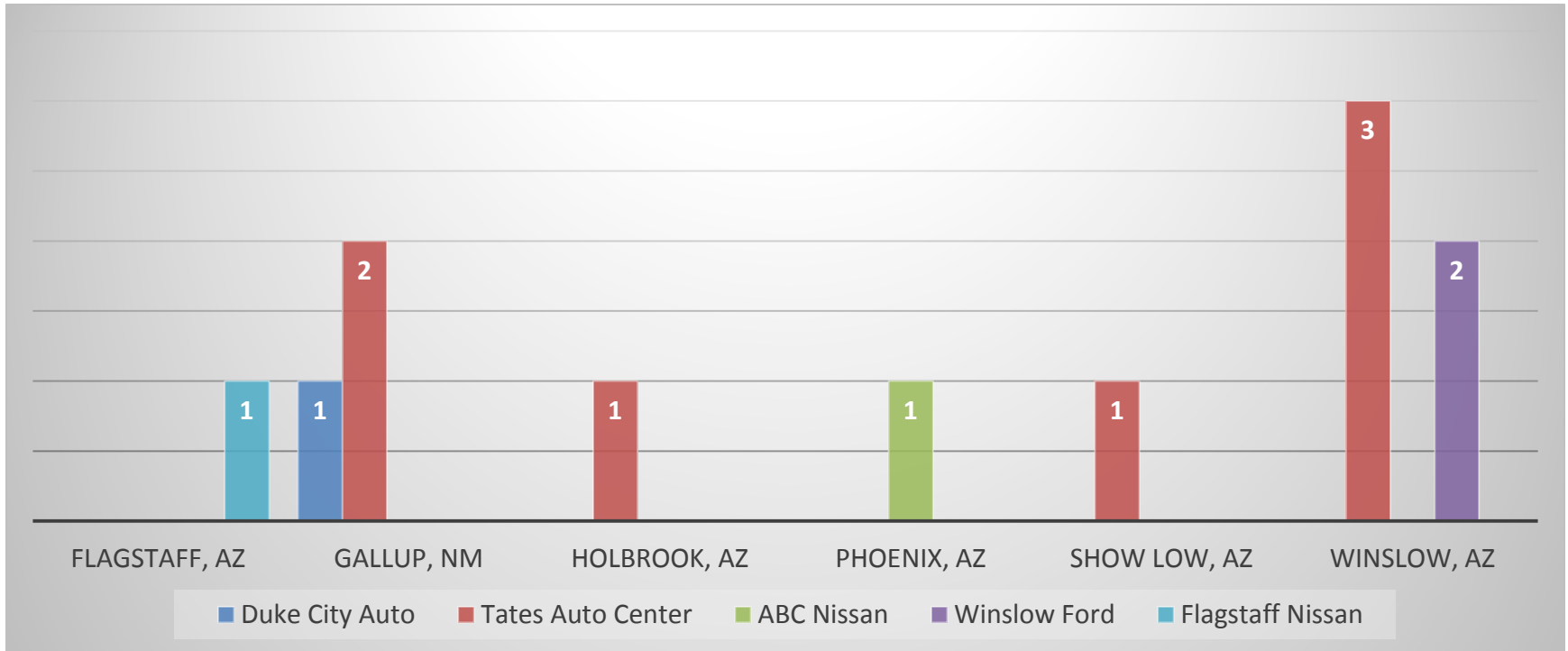


Complaint by Category



The following chart shows the issues identified in the written complaints which are categorized accordingly. For example, of the 35 complaints, 12 complaints are concerned with Predatory Vehicle Sales. Eight complaints involve Employment issues. Seven complaints listed Hopi Partitioned Land – Relocation as a concern. Four complaints were categorized as “Other” which included various issues such as Property, Homeless Beating, Auto Repair and an Estranged In-law Relationship with a Navajo Family. Two complaints list Law Enforcement/ or State Corrections as an issue. Finally, one complaint each identified Death and Education as problematic.

Predatory Auto Sale by Dealership & Location



This last chart shows the name and location of the 12 automobile dealers where predatory sales is a concern. For example, one complaint each identified Flagstaff Nissan in Flagstaff, AZ; Duke City Auto in Gallup, NM; Tates Auto Center in Holbrook, AZ; ABC Nissan in Phoenix, AZ and Tates Auto Center in Show Low, AZ as a concern. Next, two complaints each list Tates Auto Center in Gallup, NM and Winslow Ford in Winslow, AZ as an alarm. Lastly, in Winslow, Arizona, three complaints were filed regarding Tates Auto Center
